#### **SAC-Principal Report**

What's been happening at MRHS:

- Course selection process will begin very soon, updates and any important information will be sent home in the coming weeks.
- Pause for Lunch continues at lunchtime in the SchoolsPlus room, planning to have this 1-2 times per month.
- Our Learning Centre students had an amazing experience at the Unified Basketball tournament at HERH a couple of weeks ago and are heading to another tournament Thurs. March 21st at SCA.
- JH report cards are being distributed on April 3rd & SH reports on April 16th.
- April 15th- Grade 7 Immunizations are taking place at MRHS
- April 18- PD in the morning & P/T interview in the afternoon and eventing
- Transition planning is happening soon with feeder schools for Grade 6 transitions (early-mid May)
- School Musical happening in mid-May; we are taking ~200 students to watch at Bicentennial theatre
- Graduation fundraising is underway to cover graduation and prom fees and signs for the square.

# Targeted small group/Tier 2 support

Small group/Tier 2 instruction will:

- Be provided to small groups of students who are unsuccessful with Tier 1 instruction alone.
- Will be frequently monitored to ensure the intervention is being successful.
- Will occur in the pod within the classroom or within another classroom nearby depending on the size of the group.
- The resource teacher who supports in the classroom offers the Tier 2 support 3x per week.

#### Math extra help:

Lunchtime with Ms. Isenor for **Junior High** -Tuesdays & Thursdays **Senior High**- By appointment with their teacher at lunch time

**Literacy Goal:** We will improve student achievement in **literacy**, with a specific focus on our students of African and/or Mi'kmaw/Indigenous ancestry.

Next steps: Students will build vocabulary and sentence structure while implementing transitions.

**Well-Being Goal:** We will improve student well-being, with a specific focus on our students of African and/or Mi'kmaw/Indigenous ancestry.

Strategy 3: Create a welcoming environment:

We are looking to make the school feel a little more welcoming. We are in the process of looking into adding some murals in the building, like the main entrance and also in the gym. As well looking to add some more furniture such as benches, couches and plants & trees.
